# "Learning Something New"

Trying to learn something new is sometimes scary. We often create this ambiguous bubble we call a "comfort zone," and despite all the benefits that can come from learning something new, part of what makes

learning scary is the fact that we open ourselves up to the potential of failure. We ask ourselves, "What if I don't get it?" Doubt may grow in our hearts and we ask ourselves, "What if I can't get it?" This potential for failure becomes so real in our hearts that we find ourselves asking, "What if I fail?" sometimes even before we try. We do teach ourselves words of encouragement like, "If at first you don't succeed try, (and) try again." Unfortunately, if we think that we have made too many attempts, these questions of doubt often expand and also become questions of self worth. We begin to ask questions like, "What if I'm not smart enough?" or "What if I'm not good enough," and if we hold on to the doubt long enough, we might even begin to ask the question, "What if I do not matter?" Because these questions of doubt or of self worth are so burdensome and painful, it is no wonder why we sometimes try to avoid the potential for pain

altogether and shy away from trying to learn something new.

We have all experienced the fear of something new. Perhaps one of the more traumatic of these experiences is the first day of school. When we first go to a new school we might ask ourselves questions like, "What if I don't know anybody (and end up all alone)?" "What if the kids I meet are all mean (and I end up all alone)?" "What if I have mean teachers (and get picked on and then teased by all the other students and end up all alone)?" These questions often become mixed together with the association school has with learning and achieving and are added to the questions we already had regarding what it means to learn something new. Unfortunately, this only adds to our fear of learning.

Fortunately, however, most of us have experienced a modicum of success at school. I say "most" because success is often very subjective and some of us may feel that we should have done "better" even with very positive marks. This, however, points to the fact that learning is what you gain; it is not a report card. A report card can be a very useful tool. It helps us to know how well we did in a class, based on the assessment made by the teacher

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or person who assigned the grade. On the other hand, a report card does not necessarily measure what we actually learned. Sometimes, we aren't even aware of what it was that we did learn.

For example, we had to learn that learning can be scary. As a more positive example, the other day I was taught a new expression. The expression was, "friendship team." The conversation that I had when I was introduced to the expression went something like the following.

"You played basketball as a youth too?"
"Yeah, but our team wasn't very good. But, we had a lot of fun."

"Our team was competitive, but we were a small team so by the fourth quarter we didn't have any juice left. We lost most of our games." "We never even came close. But, I made a lot of close friends. We were a friendship team." "Friendship team. I've never heard that term before. That's kinda cool."

As time passes, the accolades and trophies earned are still yours to keep. On the other hand, especially based on the conversation I shared, isn't the real prize all the connections and friendships you were able to make? For example, there will come a time when we are no longer physically able to even dribble a basketball, but even then we will still be able to talk to our friends. If you were on a friendship team, then even without the accolades or trophies our friends always help us to understand that our lives do matter. More than trophies, our friends are treasures.

Unfortunately, Buddhism also makes it clear

that we cannot always expect to have the physical presence of our friends. This is another reason why Amida Buddha established and fulfilled the Fundamental Vow, the Hongan. How does the Vow help us? Through the Vow we are helped to discover that we are not just smart enough, we are given the wisdom of faith. We discover that our lives are never lacking: our lives are not just good enough, they are the reason why Amida Buddha became a Buddha. Finally, the Vow of the Buddha reveals to us how these lives of ours will always matter. Again, our lives are the reason why Amida Buddha established and fulfilled the Fundamental Vow.

Through the Vow, we are assured that we will never be alone. Just as Sakyamuni Buddha is no longer physically with us, but we are still able to appreciate being a disciple of the Buddha, our friendships—even with those who have gone to the Pure Land before us—will always continue to decorate our lives. The Vow of the Buddha helps us to not only appreciate our friends, but also helps us to receive the three treasures of Buddha, Dharma and Sangha. We learn that our lives are part of the Immeasurable Life that is Namo Amida Butsu, and that this is something we can and do share with our friends, both those in our world and those in the Buddha's. Learning something new, especially about ourselves, is

sometimes scary. But, as the Vow of the Buddha helps us to understand, it doesn't always have to be.

#### **Ichi-Mi Seeks Donations for LGBTQ+ Video Project**

Ichi-Mi is seeking donations to create a video highlighting LGBTQ+ people and supporters from a variety of Shin Buddhist communities. Donations will go towards covering production costs for the video project.

Currently, there are not a lot of resources in our Buddhist communities in support of or discussing the issue of LGBTQ+ inclusion and safety. "One of the goals of Ichi-Mi is to help educate temple Sanghas and affiliated organizations on improving LGBTQ+ inclusivity, Ichi-Mi has decided to create a video project to further that outreach.



This video project is a multiphase project. The first phase of the project is to create a short video which aims to spotlight the voices of LGBTQ+ ministers, Sangha members, parents of LGBTQ+ children and supporters. It will cover their experiences within Buddhist communities, the need for more inclusive spaces to share in the Dharma, and offer suggestions on how Buddhist communities can improve toward establishing safe spaces for all to share in the Dharma.

The goal is for the video to be shown at educational workshops at individual temples and Sangha groups, for affiliated groups such as BWA, Jr. YBA, and Dharma School teachers, and for workshop sessions at regional and national seminars. #### **Mission Statement**

The Wisteria Chugakko (Middle School) is established to enrich the academic experience, and the religious and cultural understanding of its students in order to develop academics and a greater appreciation for the potential and dignity of human and all life.

The 2023 Wisteria Chugakko Summer Session will run from Monday, June 19, through Wednesday, July 12, 2023.

**Who:** Wisteria Chugakko is a middle school summer school for students going into the 7th, 8th and 9th grade in the fall semester.

**What:** Wisteria Chugakko is a summer school program providing academic, religious and cultural education for its students.

**Where:** With the support of the Gardena Buddhist Church Board, Wisteria Chugakko holds its summer school program at the Gardena Buddhist Church.

**When:** Every summer since our Inaugural year 2018, Wisteria Chugakko has provided a middle school summer school program for 3 1/2 weeks from 8:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. After school supervision is also provided.

**Why:** The Vision and Mission of Wisteria Chugakko is to help in the development of our young adult students to become productive members of our society, community and families.

#### History:

In 2016 Reverend John Iwohara met with me, Charlene Hirotsu, to share his vision of a middle school during the summer which would provide a religious, cultural and hands-on curriculum. The purpose was to be able to pass on to our future generations our knowledge, experiences and abilities in small class size settings.

In 2017, we began with a general meeting of individuals from Gardena Buddhist Church sharing this vision. The two of us were prepared to teach classes to all of the students with our shared knowledge and passion. Soon three Gardena Buddhist Church Sangha members stepped forward and we officially began the planning and preparation for the Inaugural Year 2018 of Wisteria Chugakko. Our journey began.

To this day, we have served:

- 19 7th and 8th grade students in 2018
- 27 7th, 8th and Wisteria Leadership Program (WLP) students in 2019
- We were dark in 2020 due to COVID
- 33 7th, 8th and 9th grade students in 2021 with our virtual Wisteria Buds
- 23 7th, 8th and Wisteria Leadership program (WLP) students in 2022
- This is a total of 102 students.

#### We will have our 5 year Anniversary and Reunion in March of 2023.

We hold monthly teacher workshops from January through June to plan and prepare our teaching techniques, lesson plans and to ultimately share the culture of Wisteria Chugakko, which is one of compassion and giving. This year we had 49 teachers to participate in the various aspects of our school of 23 students. 2022 Wisteria Chugakko was truly a successful program.

#### "A Time for Action - Part 2"



As I mentioned in my April Megumi article, all of the BCA churches are addressing declining membership. We are starting on our own journey to do this at the Gardena Buddhist Church. The board established a Long Range Planning Committee which will collaborate with the existing Membership Committee on how we address membership. A lot of research and hard work lies in the future.

In parallel with this planning activity, we need to address how we can all participate. The pandemic has been a big disabler. The church reopened on September 11. The Sangha and Dharma school children have starting returning...but as of October, many who used to come prior to Covid are still missing. This article is not about just membership, but about getting our Sangha to return to hear the Dharma.

We are acting on ideas on how to welcome new visitors, potential new Sangha, retain current Sangha, and encourage those who have left to come back.

Curiosity or interest may bring visitors here. To keep them coming back requires building relationships. It means taking risks. It means approaching people we don't know and seeking out what they are looking for. Sometimes we will find out that our church doesn't provide the answers and sometimes it may. About former Sangha, why have they stopped coming? Is there something that was missing or is there something we can offer but haven't yet? How would we know if we don't engage in conversation.

I know that we have a comfort zone with our family and friends. As we move forward, I'm hoping that we will move beyond that security and take some personal risk at welcoming our visitors, getting to know them, letting them know that they are welcome, and reaching out to those who have left.
