

"Do good, help each other, save the world" (*1)

The title of this article is something that I wrote on my facebook page not too long ago. The full quote is, "Do good, help each other, save the world. If only it was as simple as writing a facebook post... or, maybe it can be."

This might be a corollary to, "All I really need to know I learned in Kindergarten," which may be a corollary to, "Hatred is never overcome by hatred. Hatred ceases through non-hatred. This is an eternal law." This last quote can be found in the Dhammapada, which is a collection of quotes made by Sakyamuni Buddha.

The Kindergarten quote is by Robert Fulghum and was written in 1990. It appeared in the book by the same title. The theme of the book, I think, can be expressed as, "We already know what we need to do. We did these things as children. Let's remember these rules we all learned and continue to do them as adults."

Although I have to admit that I am biased, I find the Buddha quote to be quite profound. It is, I think, a statement that acknowledges that The Truth is not a property to be owned and held, and therefore does not need protection

from "outsiders." Because of this there are no "outsiders." Instead, the truth is something that we all share. In fact, it is something that needs to be shared. When we are able to share, to the degree that we can, we will discover that we are all able to benefit from this sharing.

Unfortunately, we are not as wise as a Buddha. We can become possessive and protective of something that is meant for everyone. Whereas it may be true that Sakyamuni Buddha did utter the words, "Hatred is never overcome by hatred. Hatred ceases through non-hatred. This is an eternal law," what makes this statement so powerful is that it can speak to anyone regardless of what credo or religious faith a person may claim to have. The Buddha was speaking to everyone, and not just to their disciples. If the Buddha did not make this statement directly, the Buddha probably would have simply agreed. After all, the Buddha has already stated that what is being revealed is something "old." The truth is meant for everyone, regardless of when. Circumstances also do not impinge on this. For example, it is not necessary to have experienced kindergarten in order for these words to have meaning. You definitely do not need to have a facebook page.

On the other hand, it is helpful to be reminded that for those of us who have attended and gone (way) past kindergarten that we have experienced, first hand, what non-hatred can look like. We knew this as children. We know that we can help create an environment that fosters the creation of friendships. Although my facebook post doesn't really add anything to the discussion, I wanted to make the statement to remind myself that just because an act may seem insignificant, that it does not necessarily mean it is insignificant. I also posted it to encourage not just myself, but others as well. We know that we can do better. So, why not try?

(*1) This article was inspired by the students and staff of the recently concluded Wisteria Chugakko, 2022 session. Wisteria Chugakko (Chugakko is Japanese for Middle School), is the summer middle school program of the Gardena Buddhist Church. The Wisteria Chugakko is a multi-cultural, multi-generational religious, cultural, and scholastic enrichment summer school program. This article was inspired especially by the students who attended the program and who were constantly respectful, and supportive of each other. This mutual respect and support, I thought, was shared in all the laughter and smiles that could be found throughout the program. Seeing all the smiles and hearing all the laughter brought a sense of

great hope. This hope is what I was trying to express through, "Do good, help each other, save the world."

Our 2022 Wisteria Chugakko has ended with much success

The 2022 Wisteria Chugakko Summer Session began on Monday, June 20 and concluded on Wednesday, July 13, 2022 with a Culmination Bento and Program. The Culmination Program was a huge success. 160 guests in total attended the event that highlighted the accomplishments of our 23 Wisteria Chugakko students. Parents and Guests were amazed by the amount of learning and excitement their children displayed in our 3 ½ weeks of Wisteria Chugakko.

Rev. John and I were very pleased with the friendships that were created from the very first day of school by our students as demonstrated by our Icebreaker activity. It was a combination of our 7th grade, 8th grade and Wisteria Leadership Program students. With each day, the bonds became stronger and the compassion they demonstrated towards each other grew. We attribute at least a part of that to the safe environment that our teachers and staff helped to create throughout the program. The bonds created by our students also helped to create the optimal learning environment for the students. With our incredible 42 staff members, the students were exposed to an excellent curriculum of Buddhism, Jodo Shinshu, Japanese Culture and Life Skills. Our staff wants to pass on to our younger generations any knowledge, skills and kindness that we possess so they will become caring and productive young adults.

Here is a listing of notable events held as part of Wisteria Chugakko:

- ▶ Undokai at Mas Fukai Park on Friday, July 1, 2022: Students appreciated their opponents in fun relays. The day was enjoyed by all.
- ► Field trip to the Japanese American National Museum: We took this trip together to participate in the Democracy Forum Interactive Workshop. Our students were able to present their thoughts to the entire group. We viewed the documentary from 9066 to 9/11. The reflections of our students were truly amazing. We ended our day in small adult-led walking groups with a scavenger hunt in Little Tokyo.
- Incarceree presentations: Former incarcerees of the World War II camps came to speak to our students about the Japanese American experience during World War II. We were very

proud of the interest, questions and compassion shown by our students.

Culmination Bento and Program: Our 42 staff members and 23 students were very proud of our program with attendance and support from all of our families.

We would like to thank the Gardena Buddhist Church for your support throughout the program and for the use of our church facilities during the 2022 Wisteria Chugakko Summer Program.







"Wisteria Chugakko 2022"

For those of you who may not know, our church sponsors an annual Middle
School Summer program called Wisteria Chugakko. The program offers a variety of religious and
cultural classes for those students who will be entering the 7th and 8th grades in the upcoming
year.

According to Rev John, he had been advocating such a program for a long time, even before he came to Gardena. In 2016, he met with Charlene Hirotsu, a retired middle school principal, and the two of them started designing this program. It's targeted to dovetail and not compete with the Senshin Saisho Dojo (1st to 6th grades). The first three volunteers were from our ABA group, tentative but ready to learn. This is to be commended.

In 2018, the inaugural year of the program, 19 students participated. The program continued in 2019 with 25 students, and then Covid struck in 2020 and the program planning was suspended. The program restarted in 2021 with a virtual online program, Wisteria Buds. In 2022, the program returned to in-person on the property classes utilizing the church's Covid protocols.

The curriculum changes year to year based on the volunteers and the subjects they feel comfortable teaching with curriculum guidelines. These volunteers come from all over. The majority of the teaching staff come from the various organizations at Gardena Buddhist Church, ABA, Dana Group, Hui Aikane, and BWA, and now from Japanese Language School. We also have volunteers from OCBC, Higashi and Venice. Some of these volunteers have been or are a parent or grandparent of the students from the cities of Redondo Beach, Alhambra and Seal Beach.

This year's program just ended on July 13. I was able to serve as the primary photographer/videographer this year and enjoyed spending 17 days with these remarkable students, their





teachers, and the support staff. We are very fortunate to be able to offer this program. If you know of any 7th and 8th graders who might be interested or if you have an interest in volunteering, please contact Charlene Hirotsu at charlene.hirotsu@gbcwisteriachugakko.org.
