"When the weather is perfect and why we still need to rely on the Buddha"

At a recent discussion session after our Sunday Morning Remote Service, the discussion turned towards the weather of Southern California. As part of the discussion it was pointed out that the

climate of Southern California is one of the mildest and temperate to be found anywhere in the world. Our lows in the winter here are often warmer than the highs of other areas. Our highs in the summer, although it can reach into the triple digits at times (on the Fahrenheit scale for those of you who might be reading this outside of the United States), is still generally pleasant. It is often just hot enough to make you want to go to the beach to feel the cool ocean breeze. In the summer evenings the temperatures can drop drastically, but typically it only gets cold enough to make a hot cup of coffee seem heavenly.

I am mentioning this because the month of March is when we observe the Spring Equinox. It is one of the two times of the year when everything is said to be in balance. The Japanese have a saying, "The heat and the cold exist only until higan (the equinox)." Another way of expressing this might be, "Every hot season will have its higan. Every cold season will have its higan." For Southern California, however, most every day is similar to those conditions that some places can only experience two days of the year.

The observance of Ohigan is uniquely Japanese. Because of the ideal weather conditions that are typical at these two times of the year, Buddhists in Japan saw the equinox also as an ideal time to try and practice the Six Paramita or the Mahayana Buddhist practice for achieving Enlightenment. These Six Paramita were intended as a reformulation of the eight practices found in the Eightfold Path. Because of the ideal weather conditions of Southern California. you might expect that Japanese Buddhists would flood here to practice the Six Paramita under the more ideal weather conditions that exist. Buddhists already in the area, one might imagine, should be far along the path or at the very least find it advantageous to progress along that path.

In English we have the expression, "Every cloud has a silver lining." For Japanese Buddhists

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the heat of the summers and the cold of the winters could be seen as the cloud. Ohigan, then, would be the silver lining. It doesn't matter how hot the summer was, Ohigan will come. It doesn't matter how cold the winter was, Ohigan will come. Southern California weather, using this analogy, would have to be the silver lining. When we Southern Californian's complain about our weather it probably seems to others that despite having the silver lining, we go out of our way to look for the cloud.

In the Tannisho, a work written by Yuienbo or one of Shinran Shonin's students, Yuienbo would recall the following conversation that was held with Shinran Shonin:

Although I say the nenbutsu, the feeling of dancing with joy is paltry and I do not have the heart that wants to rush and go to the Pure Land. When I asked how this should be, Shinran (stated) I also have this uncertainty, and Yuienbo you too have the same heart. In carefully considering (matters), that we do not rejoice when we should rejoice to the degree of wanting to dance in the heavens and dance on earth, is to think that our going to be born has all the more been established. That which suppresses the heart that should rejoice and

does not rejoice is due to (our) troublesome worries.

There are so many things in our lives that we can rejoice, not the least of which includes having been able to meet with the Nenbutsu. Despite this, we take so much for granted. The weather in Southern California, for example, is typically *fantastic!* Unfortunately, despite this, it is very easy for us to ignore this and call our weather "typical."

Although it may be more difficult for us in Southern California to appreciate how balanced the weather is during the equinox because it seems more or less like any other day, perhaps we should still take the time

to appreciate what it means to constantly have so much and how easy it is for us to not appreciate it. When we consider this, hopefully we also begin to recognize just how big a deal the Buddha's promise of, "If there are any I cannot save, then I promise to renounce Enlightenment" really is.

The Metta Award Program

The Metta Award Program is designed to help Cub Scouts of Budhist faith to deepen their faith and to further their kinowledge and practice of the Buddhist Teachings.

The word "Metta" is a Buddhist term meaning loving kindness and goodwill. This word is selected as the name for the Cub Scout religious award with the hope of nurturing boys and girls who will relate to all animate and inanimate things with loving kindness and goodwill in their hearts.

This program will provide an opportunity for those participating in the program to relate closely with their parents and ministers on the subject of their faith.

The Boy Scouts of America has authorized the Metta Award to be worn on the official uniform centered above the flap of the left breast pocket.

The Metta Medal

The Metta Medal consists of a pendant representing the Buddhist Wheel of Dharma attached to a bar with the word "Metta". The Wheel of Dharma is the accepted symbol of the Buddhist and Buddhism.

『倒れたところがお浄土』

これは私の父がよく言っていた言葉です。若い頃の私は、この言葉を一人の念仏者の言葉として、ただ単に聞き流していました。「倒れた

ところがお浄土」というのは、本当に格好のいい言葉です。人間として、思い切りのいい、すばらしい覚悟であると受け取っていました。それは、自分の命が終わるまで、何かに没頭していて、そこに死というものが襲ってくる。死というものをそういう形で迎えることができるなんて、なんとすばらしいことであろうかと思っていました。

しかし、今は少しこの父の言葉への解釈が異 なってきました。父は果たしてそんな格好のい い言葉を残すつもりで、この言葉を言っていた のであろうかと思う様になったからです。結論 を急ぎますと、父の言いたかったのは、そんな 格好をつけただけの言葉ではなく、もっともっ と現実的な喜びの言葉だったのです。「倒れ たところ」それは死に場所ということですね。 その死に場所は、つまりお浄土なのだというこ とを言いたかったのです。倒れたところという のは、命尽きたところですから死んだ時とい うことです。死んだ時、自分はどこにいるかと いうと、それはお浄土なのだと言いたかった のでしょう。死んだところがお浄土なのですか ら、それはすばらしいところです。なぜならお 浄土とは仏さまの世界をさします。そしてそれ は真実の世界です。宗教的にいえば絶対の世 界です。その絶対真実の世界に死んだ時生ま れるのだから、死ぬということが恐ろしくない のです。恐ろしくないどころかむしろ喜んで往 (い) けるところです。そうなりますと、私の最

後の場所がどんなところであれ、そこまで私た ちの最善を尽くして生きていくことができるの です。もう少しうがった言い方をすれば、その 最後を迎えるまで、私たちはその生を楽しん で迎えることができるのです。そういうことを 父は言いたかったのでしょう。死は怖い恐ろ しいものであるというのが普通の感覚です。 それは、この「倒れたところがお浄土だ」とい う世界を知らないからです。倒れたところがお 浄土だと分かれば死ぬことはむしろ楽しいこ とになるのです。これが宗教というものです。 宗教というのは、この死の解決をつけること でした。仏教的にそれをいえば、生死(しょう じ)の解決をつけることです。なぜ生死という かというと、生きるということと死ぬるというこ とは共に生きるということなのです。死ぬこと を生きるとはおかしないい方ですが、私たち がいう死ぬということは、肉体的に死ぬという ことだけなのです。精神的にそれを見れば、そ れは生まれることなのです。生れるとはどこに 生まれるのかというと、お浄土という世界に生 まれるのです。

お浄土とは、先ほどもいいました様に真実の世界、絶対の世界です。だからそれを仏の世界と呼ぶのです。この世の中というものは、虚仮不実の世界といって、真実の世界つまり本

当の世界ではないのです。それが証拠には、こ の世には苦しみがなくなりません。争い事が絶 えないのです。人間はいつも安定した平和な世 界を求めていますが、それがどこまでいっても 実現しない世界なのです。いやいつかは平和が にその苦痛に顔を歪め 来るよといいますが、それが実現する時、この 世はまだ本当に存在しているかどうかわかった ものではありません。浄土真宗はそんな先の話 をしているではないのです。この私の命が終わ った時どうなっているかという話なのです。お念ばならないことなので 仏の教えは、今あなたが称えているその時、念 仏によって仏さまの世界、つまり真実の世界に生

まれさせていただくことができるという教えな のです。この念仏による大安心の世界がない 限り、私たちは永遠に死を恐れ、生きている ことに不安を抱きながら最後を迎えねばなら

ないのです。死んだ時 て死んでいくのか、「倒 れたところがお浄土だし といって穏やかに死ん でいくのか、今決めね しょう。
