

### "What is Other-Power?"

Other-Power is a critical doctrinal term used by Jodo Shinshu. It is fair to say that without Other-Power, there is no Jodo Shinshu. Given how important Other-Power is to Jodo Shinshu, it becomes necessary

to understand what Other-Power actually is. Unfortunately, because of its significance, the idea of Other-Power has been misused to quell ideas that are not aligned with the perspectives of those who misuse the term. Responding to this particular misuse of the term "Other-Power," critics often mention that this interpretation leads to "passivity."

What is Other-Power? First, Other-Power is used to contrast with "Self-Power." In a work titled "Notes on Once-Calling and Many-Calling," Shinran Shonin describes Self-Power in the following way:

"Self-power' characterizes those who have full confidence in themselves, trusting in their own hearts and minds, striving with their own powers, and relying on their own various roots of good." (CWS, p. 484).

Whereas "Self-Power" may be seen as "self-

reliance," it is important to keep in mind that Shinran Shonin is using the term Self-Power to help describe spiritual and religious truths. From this perspective, the self-reliance that Self-Power might suggest becomes the source for continued suffering and sorrow. The reason is because this "self" is seen as lacking in Truth: the self is "unreliable." For example, again from the "Notes on Once-Calling and Many-Calling," Shinran Shonin describes themselves and all suffering human beings, as "foolish beings":

"Foolish beings: as expressed in the parable of the two rivers of water and fire, we are full of ignorance and blind passion. Our desires are countless, and anger, wrath, jealousy, and envy are overwhelming, arising without pause; to the very last moment of life they do not cease, or disappear, or exhaust themselves." (CWS, p. 488).

Because the "Self" in "Self-Power" is unreliable, Shinran Shonin encouraged all to rely on that which is reliable. This, in other words, is the "Other" in "Other-Power." For example, in the Chapter on Practice, Shinran Shonin describes Other-Power as:

"Even more decisively will the ocean of beings of the ten quarters be grasped and never

abandoned when they have taken refuge in this practice and shinjin (Faith) <sup>1</sup>. Therefore the Buddha is called 'Amida Buddha.' This is Other Power." (CWS, p. 54)

In this passage, Shinran Shonin equates Amida Buddha with Other-Power. In a separate passage, again from the Chapter on Practice, Shinran Shonin also says:

"Other Power is none other than the power of the Tathagata's Primal Vow." (CWS, p. 57)

Here, Shinran Shonin identifies Other-Power with the activity of Amida Buddha's Vow. It is what "works" on us. These definitions will eventually help frame the reason for Shinran Shonin's writing of the Shoshin Nenbutsuge that concludes the Chapter on Practice. In introducing the Shoshinge, Shinran Shonin also quotes the following words:

"The bodhisattva takes refuge in the Buddha, just as filial children obey their parents and loyal retainers follow their rulers, with their behavior not self-centered and their acts always according with reason." (CWS, p. 68)

The phrase "their behavior not self-centered" is pointing to Other-Power. This passage, far from suggesting that we do "nothing," as is often suggested in explaining Other-Power especially

when it is used to quell ideas and actions, informs us that because of Other-Power we are allowed to become the best versions of ourselves. We are not just children, but become filial children. We are not just retainers, but become loyal retainers.

Whereas I maintain that you can't become a filial child or a loyal retainer by being passive, there are some who may argue that filiality or loyalty is a term applied by those in power to reward and maintain passive and conformist behavior. In the context of Faith, I disagree with this perspective because faith, especially if it is meant to be liberating, cannot be passive. Instead, Jodo Shinshu Faith is dynamic. It is, for example, what gives us the courage to look deeply at ourselves. As Jodo Shinshu Buddhists, Faith is what gives us the courage to see ourselves as "foolish beings." Faith is also what gives us the inspiration and impetus to behave kindly and be thoughtful towards others despite being a foolish being. It is, for instance, what allowed Shinran Shonin to do things like write the Shoshin Nenbutsuge and help countless others to discover Faith for themselves and motivate them to share this Faith with others.

# 「中道」の教え

仏教の大事な教えの中に 「中道」という考えがありま す。中道というのは、その 読んで字の如く真ん中の 道ということです。

しかし、この真ん中の道ということは、例えば十字路に突き当たって、さて、右へ行くか左へ行くか、それとも真ん中の道をいくかどれにしようかと迷っている時、その右でも左でもない真ん中の道を取るというような場合の真ん中という意味にとる人がたくさんいるのです。普通の場合にはそれでいいのでしょうが、仏教でいう中道とは、こういう意味とは少し違う意味で中道というのです。

結論を先に言っておきます。仏教でいう中道とは、 右や左ではなく真ん中の道をいくという真ん中では なく、右でもなく左でもない道ということなのです。 え、それじゃ、やっぱり真ん中の道ということじゃな いかと思われる方がおられると思いますが、よく注 意して聞いてみてください。今、私は右でもなく左 でもない道と言ったのです。真ん中の道とは言って いません。え、それはどういうことですかということに なりますよね。仏教でいう右でもなく左でもないとい うことは、右と左を共に否定しているという意味なの です。だから、真ん中の道を取りなさいと言っている のではないのです。右でも左でもない道をとりなさ いといっているのです。

それでは、どういうことをお釈迦さまは言おうとされ たのかというと、その右とか左とかという考えを超え なさいと言われたのです。私たちは、物事を考える のにすぐにそれが右か左か、つまり正しいか正しく ないかと分けて、その正しいと思った道を取るという のが普通ですが、その時正しいとか正しくないとい うことにこだわってはいけないと言われるのです。正 しいとか正しくないとかいうことは、そのときのTPO. つまり状況によって変わってくるものなのですよとい うのがお釈迦さまが言いたいことなのです。だから、 人生の大きな問題にぶっつかった場合、私たちは右 か左か迷った時に、どちらへいけばいいかということ を決める時、一度その右か左かを超えた視点から その場を考えなさいとおっしゃってくださっているの です。この右か左かを一度越えてみるということが「 中道」を取れという教えなのです。

私たちはこの中道という考えを持たずに、自分たちの今までの生活経験によって全てを決めてしまうのです。この生活経験のことを仏教では「業」と呼んでいます。私たちは正しいとか正しくないとか、白か黒か、あるいは生か死か、を考える時全てこの「業」によって判断しているのです。しかし、それでは本当の判断は下せないというのが仏教という教えです。
