

"Happy New Year"

2024 is the Year of the Dragon. 2024 will also be the first time we will be able to hold an in-person ojinjo service in preparation for our Goshoki Hoonko service since the temple closure due to the Covid

pandemic. Fortunately, things are returning to "normal." However, given that 2026 is the temple's centennial, we are also given the opportunity to look back at the temple's history, while looking forward towards possibilities. Because of these circumstances, we are also being given the opportunity to define what "normal" was, is and can be.

For better or worse, our current situation immediately makes us think of what was normal as how things were just prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, what is normal as learning when and how to apply our technology of providing in-person, remote, or hybrid services and events, and what can be normal as the possibility of applying even more technology to what we offer. For example, it isn't too hard to imagine being able to simulcast in multiple languages with the advances being made in language translation software.

When talking about something like a centennial, it is natural for us to look back. We sometimes look back with nostalgia, while at other times we dismiss the past because it has passed. The past, however, is important because it informs and often colors our perception of the present and the future. For example, I have been very influenced by a scene in the 1962 Disney film, "Son of Flubber" when Professor Brainard (played by Fred MacMurray) states. "Anyone who falls flat on his face is at least moving in the right direction: forward." I have also been greatly influenced by "Star Trek" and it's themes of diversity and inclusion, and how sharing the abilities of everyone can help make possibilities turn into mutually beneficial realities. Unfortunately, both these examples only share how a past experience can help you have hope for the future.

As an example of how the past can help inform and color our perception of the present, I would like to share a story that was told by Reverend Shoki Mohri who was serving as the Rinban of the Los Angeles Hompa Hongwanji while I was growing up there. What Mohri Sensei (Sensei is Japanese for "Teacher") related was their experience as a soldier for the Japanese

military during World War 2. Prior to their military service, Reverend Mohri told us how they grew up in a Jodo Shinshu temple family and how they were disinterested in studying a teaching that developed in 12th century Japan. Although the technological advances made war even deadlier than in the past, it also made the world seem as if it had graduated from the days when humanity still feared the night for lack of adequate light. We were told that, at that time, Mohri Sensei wondered what good continuing to read verses like the Shoshin Nenbutsuge could have in a world that Shinran Shonin probably couldn't even have imagined. Then, Mohri Sensei was conscripted to join the war. Over time, it became obvious that Japan would lose the war, and Sensei, together with their entire unit, evacuated and tried to flee back to Japan before they were killed. Unfortunately, many of Reverend Mohri's unit, also young men conscripted to serve, did not make it back. As you can imagine, the war seemed empty of all meaning to Sensei. Humanity, itself, was questioned.

It was, however, at the time when Mohri Sensei returned home to the temple, that they noticed people were still chanting the Shoshin Nenbutsuge. We were told that this experience helped Sensei to recover their sense of humanity. Through seeing this, Mohri Sensei became aware of a Universal Truth that neither can nor will change over time. Sensei discovered something reliable to return home to. Relying on human intellect, human innovation, human progress alone has its limitations and flaws because we as humans are limited and flawed. In Mohri Sensei's case, the War and all the technological advances that

were utilized in waging that war, made Sensei doubt the very meaning of their existence. During our hoonko season, we will once again be focused on chanting the Shoshin Nenbutsuge or a tradition that Jodo Shinshu Buddhists have maintained and shared for centuries. This is not done out of nostalgia or to maintain a centuries old tradition. As shared in Reverend Mohri's story, we continue to do this to allow ourselves, and others, the opportunity to see and experience for themselves the Truth that can always be relied upon.

This vision of the past, one where the Wisdom and Compassion of Amida Buddha was fulfilled in order to help us to understand that we are part of a Universal Truth that embraces all and forsakes none, is one we can use to inform and color our perception of the present. Hopefully, this vision of the present is one that will allow all of us to discover a future where we are all helping each other move in the right direction, and one where we can appreciate both diversity and inclusion.





今自分を取り巻く人間関係を考えると、あの人が憎い、あの人さえいなければとかあの人にこんな目に遭わされたという方が一人もいません。よくぞこんな私とお友達でいてくださる、ずっと法友であり続けたいと思う方々ばかりです。人に恵まれるということの喜びを感じております。その分お別れが寂しいのですが、私たちにはまた逢えるという喜びもあります。南無阿弥陀仏のお慈悲の中での出会いと別れであり、仏となってまた一如の世界で再会が約束されていることはありがたいことです。

さて仏教ではこの世を"濁世"(濁った世の中)と呼んでいます。戦争・環境問題・詐欺・政治不審・フェイクニュース・虐待。私たちは間違いなく濁世の中に生きています。生きているどころか私自身がそれにまみれ濁りを生み出しています。

親鸞聖人のお言葉が集められている歎異抄には『 煩悩具足の凡夫、火宅無常の世界は、よろずのこ と、みなもって、そらごと たわごと、まことあることな きに・・』とあります。我々が作り出す世界は偽り嘘言 の世界である。つまり濁世であることは昔から変わ ってないのです。

ではこの濁った世をどう生き抜いていけば良いのでしょうか。親鸞聖人はその後に『ただ念仏のみぞまことにておわします』と断言されています。ただとは、ただこのこと一つという意味です。『ただ念仏』とは、この濁世を逃げ出す方法ではありません。濁世を打ち砕く精神でもありません。『ただ念仏』とは濁世に住む方法、生き方なのです。濁世この世は道場と言う意味です。私はこの濁世の道場に蓮の花(お念仏)をいただいて、お念仏の同朋(法友)と共に生き抜いていきたいと思っています。
